**GRIZZLY.** You can choose to start May 6th which is the easiest way or May 25th when the moose and caribou are calving and the grizzly are hunting them. A great time to be out.

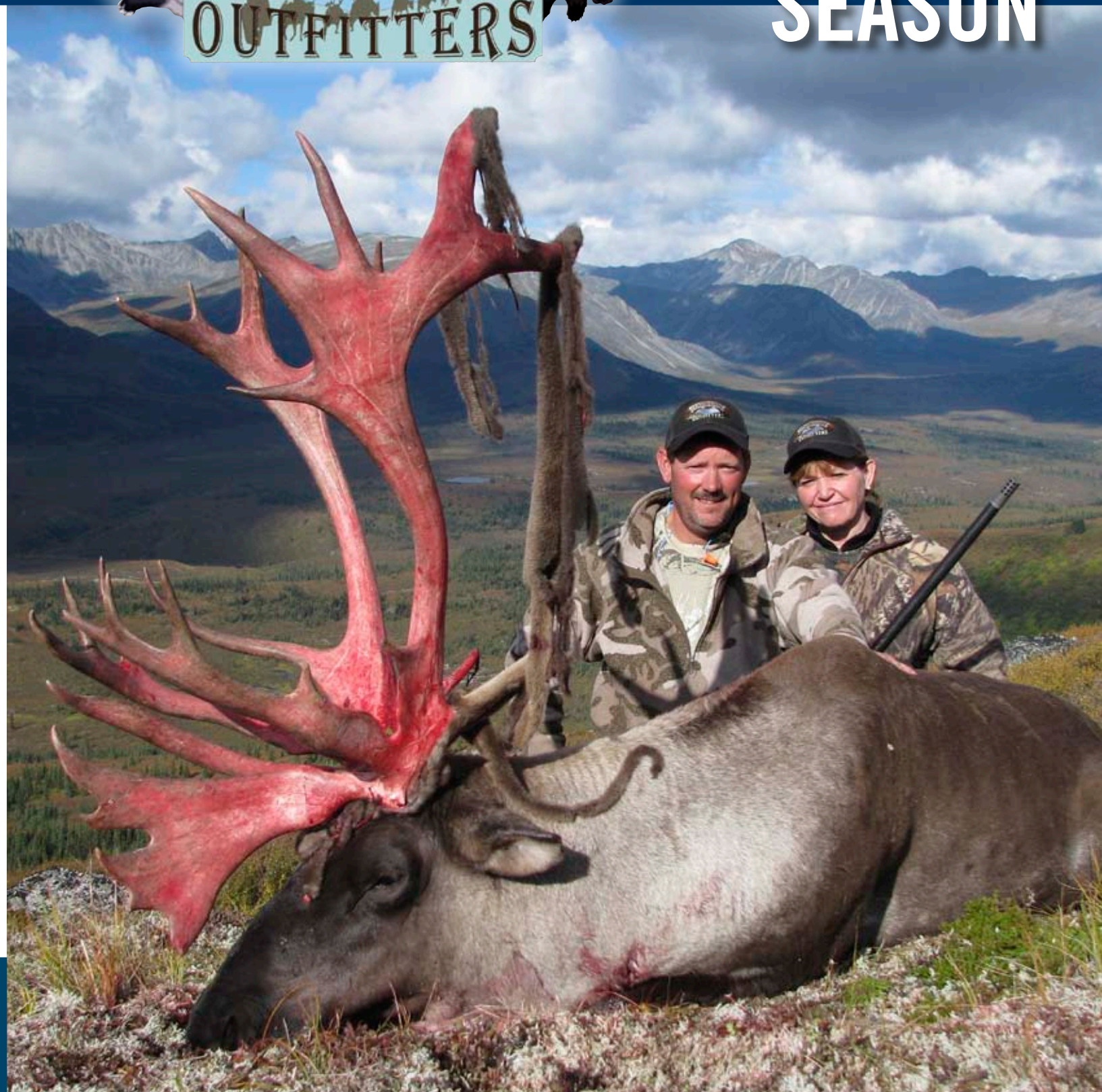
**WOLF.** We will be continuing our wolf program this winter and still have room for a few people in March.

**SHEEP.** The first ATV/back pack hunt is still open as well as the Aug 11th horseback hunt. We rested this area so there should be a big ram waiting for you.

**GOAT.** We will be hunting the South Camp area which hasn't been hunted for several years. This area produces many of our best, oldest billies. Start dates Aug 11th and 26th.

**CARIBOU.** We have openings starting Aug 11th and 26th. The first openings can make a great goat/caribou combo. The 26th is as good plus one can often add moose and grizzly. This hunt also goes into Caribou Flats, one of our best trophy caribou camps.

**MOOSE.** We still have a number of openings on all the rut hunts. Moose have responded particularly well to our wolf management. This shows in higher calf and mature bull survival. This means more selection of the big ones for you.

## Come Hunt Canada's Yukon With Us



Well, another year has come and gone. The big highlight was the wolf trapping. We were able to trap on Ruth's new line and several others on the Hyland River including the Taffie Creek country. The resulting moose and caribou calf crop was fantastic. I would like to thank Ruth, Dave O'Farrel and Charles Brodhagen for giving me permission to trap their lines. I'm also sure the moose and caribou, especially the calves would also like to thank them.

November was spent breaking in Ruth's new trap line. We managed to get 40 martin (several of which were in the top lots on the fur actions), two wolverine and four wolves. This seemed to have an impact on the Nahanni caribou and moose which produced a great calf crop, as high as six calves per 10 cows for the caribou. On the late hunt we saw 5 cow moose with 6 calves, yes that was 6 calves.

I set up my line with Fred Bauchet around the end of Nov. We caught him a marten, wolf, wolverine and lynx so he left happy. I took 20 more marten and a couple wolves before Christmas.

We then went to Dallas Safari Club in Jan. and did well. Between Dallas and SCI we had a great time in New Mexico. I got some snow and Ruth got a bit of sun. SCI was also great as we left the show booked for 2010. I headed home to wolf trapping while Ruth went on a cruise with Reggie (Dave's wife), toured Florida and met me in Las Vegas for the Grand Slam Ovis which was also a success. We left Vegas and arrived in Watson only to find out our friend and the longest operating outfitter in the Yukon, if not North America, Pete Jensen passed away. We all miss him.

Don Knowlton hunted with us in Feb. He shot a big old wolf and we trapped him a lynx, marten and wolverine. Mark Bauer hunted a bit later. We caught many wolves with him but he didn't get to shoot one. They did see a couple on the last day but overflow on the lake ruined the stalk. He did take three wolves home as well as a couple of lynx, a wolverine and a marten.

By the end of March Joel and I had taken 36 wolves. In late March and early April we fixed up Goat's Bluff and Lucky Lake camps and cut the lumber for Ruth's cabin.

We did not book a spring bear hunter so May was a quiet month. Rob and Liz, Dave and Reggie, Walter and Irene, Ruth, Joel and I took a jet boat trip up the Ketchika and Turnagain Rivers and really had a great camp out.

We had a mini reunion in late June with my sister Yvonne and her family and my brother Gary and part of his family. We spent most of the time up on Ruth's trap line and ending with a quick trip to the Coal River Springs. From the comments, I think they enjoyed themselves.

We finally got permission to build a cabin on Ruth's line in late June so we had to put it up in early July. It still needs some work but will be usable this winter.

We were delayed by the cabin so didn't get as much done at Ceaser as hoped. The horses were trailed in around the 15th. We put the shoes on and then went over and fixed the Coal River strip.

Donn and repeat client Perry Hisaw flew in to Dendale on the 30th and were sheep hunting on the first. Again they saw lots of rams, taking a nice ram that would have not made the winter due to a broken jaw. Fabian and I guided Jake Hollis, one of our youth hunters. It took two days but Fabian was

able to get him up on a beautiful 58 inch bull. His dad, Brian and I got to watch it all. Both days.

Fabian and I trailed over to the Coal Strip with Johnny Johnson (cougar guide) and his cousin, Rusty, for a couple days fishing. Josh and Heather Slager flew in on the 10th for their hunt. They got a goat, moose and on the last day, a caribou. Donn and Trevor Magun (our horse wrangler) guided another repeat client David Riddle to a goat and a black bear at this time.

Next up was Jimmie and Cindy Keyes who Joel and James guided. Jimmie had booked a goat hunt but had taken one in Alaska earlier so was looking for a caribou. They hunted the Lucky Lake country and didn't see a calf. This is in an area we couldn't trap wolves. Hopefully we can this winter. They did get a nice caribou. Fabian and Trevor guided Randy Hancock to a nice 12 year old billy during this time, then hunted Ceaser. They saw many calves there, has to be a result of wolf management.

Donn and Fabian were booked to guide a father/son hunt for caribou but they cancelled at the last minute so both had a week off.

Repeat hunter Bruce Brown and Dave hunted goat by boat starting on Sept. 4th. They saw a number of goats but either weren't able to get up on them or the goats would move so didn't take one but as they were drifting down one morning, they spotted a grizzly eating on the bank. When they cut the motor to watch, the bear looked at them and charged. They had to shoot him before he got into the boat. It was an old grizzly, no teeth or fat with a bad attitude.

Joel and Kamran Khosrani started on the 10th. They missed a moose and a wolf – then shot a goat, caribou and moose all in

four days. The moose was unique in that it had 3 horns on one side.

Josh Slager and his son, Tyler, returned for Tyler's hunt. Tyler bagged a beautiful 61 1/2 inch bull – best of the year scoring 560 SCI and then Josh took a grizzly. Josh will soon have a TV serial with some of his hunts including his Yukon series. Fabian and Donn were the guides.

Robbie and Gary Curtin moved to Joel Creek on the 14th as the dry weather had dropped the Hyland's water level to where we couldn't get up it. They saw nine smaller bulls but were unable to go back into the hot spots where the big ones were.

The Sept. 23rd hunt had Donn and Bob Buckley start at Joel Lake only to listen to wolves' howl. They transferred to Toobally where they took a bull on the last day. Dave guided Bob's partner Lavern Wock to an early moose but it escaped and they could not find it even using our PA 12. Robbie guided Mark Dugger to a moose about the third day and Joel and Robert Salamon who took the honors for the oldest hunter of the year also shot a nice bull.

The last rut hunt had Robbie taking Dieter Pflannenstain to his bull on the way into camp. Donn and Gunter Geistderfer got his the next day. Dave and another repeat client Steve Keithley were third and Joel and Dennis(DJ) Jones came in last. Joel video tapped the whole show while calling it in. Dennis shot it at 4 yards. This fantastic footage has been posted on youtube. There is a link on our web site. Steve and Dennis both took nice bulls with their bows.

Dave and Steve were checking for grizzly and literally stumbled onto Lavern's moose from an earlier hunt. The meat was ruined but antlers were great.

The last moose hunter was Sam Switzerbaum. Joel and he took a nice bull on day two finishing the moose hunts with a grand old bull.

Charles Herron and Jimmie Speaks came up for the late caribou hunts. Donn and I were the fortunate guides but the caribou left early so we really worked to get them two nice bulls.
